Marshall Shawl

This is a simple mesh shawl that can be made with any weight of yarn. Use a hook a couple sizes above what is typically recommended for the yarn weight. I used worsted weight yarn with a K hook.

Your yardage will depend on how large you make the shawl and what yarn weight you use.

Notes:

The chain 4 at the beginning of the row counts as a dc and ch 1 space. The first three ch will count as a dc in the stitch count.

Inc = dc, ch 1, dc in same space

Shawl:

Chain 4, ss in first ch

Row 1: chain 4, dc into ring, [ch 1, dc], repeat [] 6 more times (8 dc, 7 ch sp)

Row 2: (place a marker in the chain space of each increase as you work them) chain 4, dc in first ch sp, ch 1, [inc in next ch sp, ch 1, dc in next ch sp, ch 1], repeat [] twice more, dc in 3rd chain of the previous row's starting chain

Row 3: chain 4, (dc, ch 1) in every ch sp around, working an increase when you get to the stitch markers, and ending with a dc in the third ch of the starting ch

Repeat Row 3 for as large as you want the shawl

Edging:

Ch 1, sc in ch sp, [5 hdc in next ch sp, sc in next ch sp], repeat around, fasten off
