

# Santiago Sweater

## Hooks

G - 4mm  
H - 5 mm  
I - 5.5 mm

Note: Gauge is based on H hook; if using a different size, you will also need a hook that is one size up, and a hook that is one size down.

## Yarn

Knit Picks Shine Worsted - 75 yds

Sweater: MC - 3 balls, CC - 2 balls

Vest: MC - 2 balls, CC - 2 balls

Hat: MC - 1 ball, CC - 1 ball

Note: You will probably have enough of CC leftover to make the stripes for the hat.

Sweater shown in Sailor (MC) and Robot (CC)

Vest shown in Macaw (MC) and Citrine (CC)

## Other

3 buttons - 1 inch

## Size

18 in. chest  
(0-3 months)

Hat: 13 in. around

## Gauge

11.5 stitches and 10 rows per 4 inches in esc rows with H hook

## Special Stitches

extended single crochet (esc):

insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull the yarn through the stitch, yarn over, pull through one loop, yarn over again, pull through both loops.

extended single crochet decrease (esc dec):

insert hook into next stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through one loop, insert hook into next st, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through one loop, yarn over, pull through all 3 loops

## Notes

1. The sweater and vest are worked in one piece up to the armholes.
2. Odd numbered rows are right side rows.
3. The ch 1 does not count as a stitch.
4. When changing colors, work the last stitch of the row tightly. To change colors, work the last stitch up to the last yo and yo with new color and pull through; continue. Carry unused yarn along the edge or along the wrong side.
5. The sweater and vest are worked the same up to the armholes. The vest has 2 unworked stitches at each armhole when the fronts and back are worked to allow space for the armhole edging.

## Cardigan Sweater

### BODY

With H hook and MC, loosely chain 51.

- Row 1: (RS) esc into second ch from the hook, esc in each chain (50 st)
- Row 2: (WS) ch 1, turn, esc in each st, (50 st)
- Row 3: ch 1, turn, esc in each st
- Row 4: ch 1, turn, esc in each st, changing to CC at the end of the last st
- Row 5: ch 1, turn, with CC, esc in each st, ch 1, turn
- Row 6: ch 1, turn, with CC, esc in each st, changing to MC at the end of the last st
- Row 7: ch 1, turn, with MC, esc in each st
- Row 8: ch 1, turn, with MC, esc in each st, changing to CC at the end of the last stitch
- Row 9: ch 1, turn, with CC, esc in each st
- Row 10: ch 1, turn, with CC, esc in each st, changing to MC at the end of the last stitch

Row 11: ch 1, turn, with MC esc in each st

Row 12: ch 1, turn, esc in each st

Row 13: ch 1, turn, esc in each st

### FIRST FRONT

- Row 14: (WS) ch 1, turn, esc next 12 st, (12 st)
- Row 15: (RS) ch 1, turn, esc next 9 st, esc dec, esc in last st (11 st)
- Row 16: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 8 st (10 st)
- Row 17: ch 1, turn, esc next 10 st (10 st)
- Row 18: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 7 st (9 st)
- Row 19: ch 1, turn, esc next 6 st, esc dec, esc in last st (8 st)
- Row 20: ch 1, turn, esc next 8 st (8 st)
- Row 21: ch 1, turn, esc next 5 st, esc dec, esc in last st (7 st)
- Row 22: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 4 st (6 st)
- Row 23: ch 1, turn, esc next 6 st (6 st)
- Row 24: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc in next 3 st (5 st)
- Row 25: ch 1, turn, esc in next 5 st, fasten off (5 st)

## BACK

With wrong side facing, join yarn in 13<sup>th</sup> stitch. Ch 1.

Row 14: (WS) esc in same st as join, esc next 25 st (26 st)

Row 15-24: ch 1, turn, esc next 26 st

Row 25: ch 1, turn, esc next 26 st, fasten off.

## SECOND FRONT

With wrong side facing, join yarn in 39<sup>th</sup> stitch. Ch 1.

Row 14: (WS) esc in same st as join, esc next 11 st (12 st)

Row 15: (RS) ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc in next 9 st (11 st)

Row 16: ch 1, turn, esc next 8 st, esc dec, esc in last st (10 st)

Row 17: ch 1, turn, esc next 10 st (10 st)

Row 18: ch 1, turn, esc next 7 st, esc dec, esc in last st (9 st)

Row 19: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 6 st (8 st)

Row 20: ch 1, turn, esc next 8 st (8 st)

Row 21: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 5 st (7 st)

Row 22: ch 1, turn, esc next 4 st, esc dec, esc in last st (6 st)

Row 23: ch 1, turn, esc next 6 st (6 st)

Row 24: ch 1, turn, esc next 3 st, esc dec, esc in last st (5 st)

Row 25: ch 1, turn, esc in next 5 st, fasten off (5 st)

Whipstitch front shoulders to back, matching the stitches.

## SLEEVES

Note:

1. Turn at the end of each row to maintain stitch pattern except for the cuff, which is worked with the right side always facing.
2. Smaller hook is used for cuff.

Using H hook and MC, with right side facing, join yarn at center underarm.

Round 1: ch 1, esc in same sp, esc 25 st around the armhole, ss to first st (26 st)

Round 2: ch 1, turn, esc around, ss to join to first st (26 st)

Repeat Round 2 until the sleeve is 5"- 5 ½" long, changing to CC at the end of the last round.

## CUFF

Round 14: Switch to smaller hook and using CC, sc in each stitch around, ss to join to first st, DO NOT TURN (26 st)

Round 15: ch 1, sc around, ss to join to first st

Round 16: ch 1, sc around, ss to join to first st

Round 17: ch 1, sc around, ss to join to first st. Fasten off.

## BORDER

### Notes:

1. To make buttonholes, mark the buttonhole placement on whichever side you prefer. When you reach that point in Round 3, ch 2, sk 2 st, continue sc to next buttonhole.
2. Do not turn between these rounds.
3. Some crocheters tend to work the sc border more tightly than the rest of the sweater. It is suggested that you use the larger hook for the border. If your edges pull in too much, try adding more stitches to the front edges.

Using I hook and CC, join yarn at middle back with right side facing.

Round 1: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc across the bottom, 2 sc in last st, 2 sc in first space on the front edge, sc evenly up the edge to the beginning of the neck decreases, 2 sc in last sp of the front edge, 2 sc in first sp of neck edge, sc evenly up the neck edge, sc across the back of the neck, sc around the rest of the sweater, following the same directions and increasing in the same places. ss to join to first st.

Round 2: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each st around, increasing 2 st in each of the lower front corners, and increasing 1 st in each of the corners at the base of the V neck, ss to join to first st.

Round 3: (*buttonhole row*) Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each st around, increasing 2 st in each of the lower front corners, and increasing 1 st in each of the corners at the base of the V neck, working buttonholes on preferred side of front (see note), ss to join to first st.

Round 4: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each st around, increasing 2 st in each of the lower front corners, and increasing 1 st in each of the corners at the base of the V neck, working 2 sc in each buttonhole space, ss to join to first st. Fasten off.

Securely weave in all ends.

Sew on buttons.





## Sweater Vest

### BODY

Follow body instructions (Rows 1-13) for cardigan sweater on page 2.

### FIRST FRONT

- Row 14: (WS) ch 1, turn, esc next 11 st (11 st)  
Row 15: (RS) ch 1, turn, esc next 8 st, esc dec, esc in last st (10 st)  
Row 16: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 7 st (9 st)  
Row 17: ch 1, turn, esc next 9 st (9 st)  
Row 18: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 6 st (8 st)  
Row 19: ch 1, turn, esc next 5 st, esc dec, esc in last st (7 st)  
Row 20: ch 1, turn, esc next 7 st (7 st)  
Row 21: ch 1, turn, esc next 4 st, esc dec, esc in last st (6 st)  
Row 22: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 3 st (5 st)  
Row 23: ch 1, turn, esc next 5 st (5 st)  
Row 24: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc in next 2 st (4 st)  
Row 25: ch 1, turn, esc in next 4 st, fasten off (4 st)

### BACK

With wrong side facing, join yarn in 14<sup>th</sup> stitch. Ch 1.

- Row 14: (WS) esc in same st as join, esc next 23 st (24 st)  
Row 15-24: ch 1, turn, esc next 24 st  
Row 25: ch 1, turn, esc next 24 st, fasten off.

### SECOND FRONT

With wrong side facing, join yarn in 40<sup>th</sup> stitch. Ch 1.

- Row 14: (WS) esc in same st as join, esc next 10 st (11 st)  
Row 15: (RS) ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc in next 8 st (10 st)  
Row 16: ch 1, turn, esc next 7 st, esc dec, esc in last st (9 st)  
Row 17: ch 1, turn, esc next 9 st (9 st)  
Row 18: ch 1, turn, esc next 6 st, esc dec, esc in last st (8 st)  
Row 19: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 5 st (7 st)  
Row 20: ch 1, turn, esc next 7 st (7 st)  
Row 21: ch 1, turn, esc next st, esc dec, esc next 4 st (6 st)  
Row 22: ch 1, turn, esc next 3 st, esc dec, esc in last st (5 st)  
Row 23: ch 1, turn, esc next 5 st (5 st)  
Row 24: ch 1, turn, esc next 2 st, esc dec, esc in last st (4 st)  
Row 25: ch 1, turn, esc in next 4 st, fasten off (4 st)

Whipstitch front shoulders to back, matching each stitch.



## ARMHOLE

Note: Do not turn between rounds.

Using I hook and CC, with right side facing, join yarn at center underarm.

Round 1: ch 1, sc in same sp, sc 27 st around the armhole, ss to join to first st (26 st)

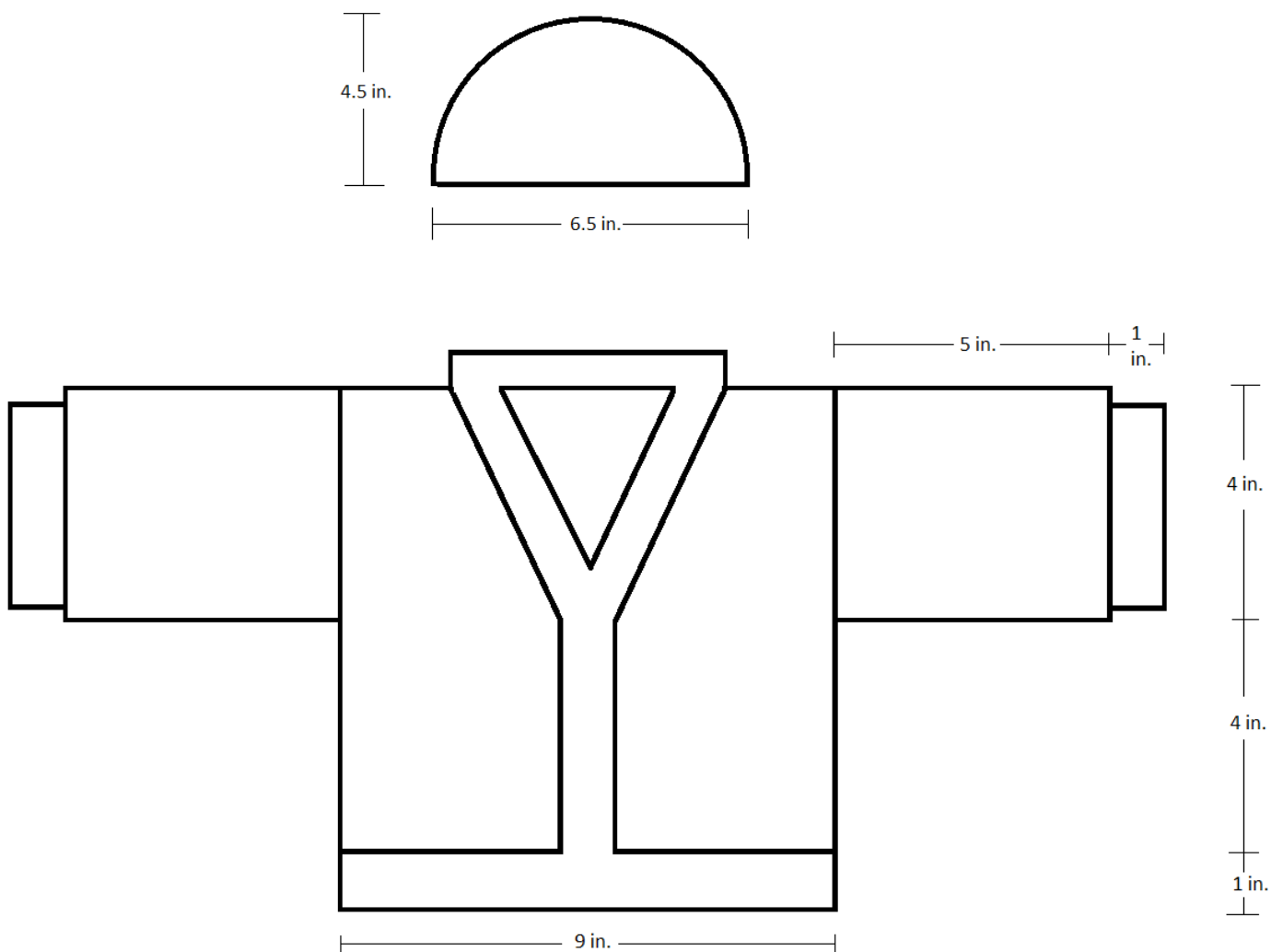
Round 2: ch 1, sc around, ss to join to first st, fasten off.

## BORDER

Follow border instructions for cardigan sweater on page 4.

Securely weave in ends.

Sew on buttons.



## Hat

### Note:

1. Hat is worked in rounds that are turned to maintain the same stitch pattern as the sweater.
2. Carry unused color on the inside of hat. Be careful to make sure that the unused color stays on the inside of the hat when changing colors.
3. To make a larger or smaller hat, adjust hook size or add an extra increase round, being sure to change colors on RS rows.

With I hook and MC, ch 4. SS into first ch to make a ring.

Round 1: (RS) Ch 1, esc into ring 9 times, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join (9 st)

Round 2: (WS) Ch 1, turn, 2 esc in each st around, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join (18 st)

Round 3: Ch 1, turn, \*2 esc in next st, 1 esc in next st\*, repeat \* \*, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join (27 st)

Round 4: Ch 1, turn, \*2 esc in next st, 1 esc in next 2 st\*, repeat \* \*, changing to CC at the end of last st, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join (36 st)

### Abbreviations:

\* \* = instructions bet \* \*'s as many times as noted

CC = contrasting color

ch = chain

esc = extended single crochet

esc dec = extended single crochet decrease

in. = inch

Round 5: With CC, ch 1, turn, esc around, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join (36 st)

Round 6: With CC, ch 1, turn, esc around, changing to MC at the end of last st, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join

Round 7: With MC, ch 1, turn, esc around, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join

Round 8: With MC, ch 1, turn, esc around, changing to CC at end of last st, ss in 1<sup>st</sup> st to join

Round 9: Repeat Round 5

Round 10: Repeat Round 6

Round 11-13: Repeat Round Round 7

Fasten off.

Weave in ends securely.

### Ideas for Changes

For a cool-weather baby, try this sweater with Knit Picks Chroma Worsted for a high-impact look with no effort.

Add stripes on the whole sweater.

If making for a girl, start off with a lace pattern, and then switch to the written pattern at the armholes.
